"The Truth About the Devlins," by Lisa Scottoline. TJ Devlin is the proverbial black sheep of his family. A recovering alcoholic, TJ's done stints in rehab and prison. In a family of attorneys with successful – and expensive – law firm, having a criminal background makes Sunday dinners with the clan a bit awkward. It also makes it hard to get a job. Thankfully, his family gets him a job at the family firm working as an investigator. Life's, such as it is being the family disappointment, rolls along until a midnight confession from his brother, John turns TJ's life upside down.
