New fiction

"Camino Ghosts," by John Grisham. Once a haven for runaway slaves, Dark Isle is now known for its reputation as being cursed, thanks to drownings and disappearances. Located off the Florida coast, Dark Isle is mostly abandoned, but perhaps not for long? Real estate developers are circling the island like sharks, hungry for the big payouts that would come their way should they be able to build their hotels, condos, golf courses and casinos. One person, however, stands in their way. Lovely Jackson, a descendant of those long-ago slaves, contends Dark Isle belongs to her and she will not let it become a playground for the rich. But how can one person take on developers who have money and power at their disposal? Enter Steve Mahon, environmental lawyer, and Mercer Mann, author, both of whom will help Lovely prove she is the owner of the island.
